Professorship in Clinical Chemistry

at the Department of Laboratory Medicine, Lund. The post may include employment as specialist/consultant at Clinical Chemistry, Laboratory Medicine Skåne.

Job description

Research and research tuition are the predominant tasks, but instruction at first and second cycle programs are also included. The holder is expected to be active in the development of the clinical part of the specialty of Clinical Chemistry. The post also comprises tasks normally associated with the position of a professor, such as administration, commissions as expert adviser and the role of representing the subject in national and international contexts. Duties can also be added to.

Qualifications

According to Chapter 4, Section 5 of the Higher Education Ordinance, a person is qualified for appointment as Professor if he or she has demonstrated both academic and teaching skills.

Basis for assessment

At the Department of Laboratory Medicine in Lund, translational research is conducted within the nine Divisions of the Department, including the Division of Clinical Chemistry & Pharmacology. The successful applicant is expected to take on a role as a representative and expert in Clinical Chemistry issues to promote such translational research in joint projects with the Skåne University Hospital, Laboratory Medicine Skåne and the Medical Faculty in Lund.

The successful applicant must be able to document research expertise and teaching skills with a bearing on the subject. When assessing the candidates' qualifications, attention will primarily be paid to research skills, requiring the candidate to document skills as a researcher at a high national and international level. It is an added qualification if the candidate's research profile includes cell- and molecular biology or protein chemistry that reflect the future of clinical chemistry.

The successful applicant must be able to document the ability to supervise doctoral students and to develop and to initiate, develop and lead research activities including a capacity for academic leadership and cooperation.

Teaching skill is also an essential qualification, to be demonstrated by instruction in first-, second- and third-cycle programmes. The candidate must also have experience of academic leadership at various levels. It is important that the successful candidate has the ability to work actively and constructively in interactive environments. Attention will also be paid to administrative skills and the ability to interact with the surrounding community. Applicants should preferentially have specialist skills in Clinical Chemistry, but other applicants with a research profile that can be of benefit for Clinical Chemistry are also welcomed. It is considered advantageous if the applicant's research profile includes aspects of medical/clinical protein chemistry, enzymology, proteomics and/or protein- and DNA-based diagnostics, to easily fit in and reinforce existing local research and development activities.

By the application deadline the following documentation must be submitted in **4** copies, divided into 4 packages:

1. A summarised and certified CV to be placed first in each package, using the template available at the following webpage: www.cv.med.lu.se
2. A full list of publications, according to the guidelines of the Academic Appointments Board at: www.med.lu.se/lfn/publikationslista
NB! Abstracts should not be included in the publication list!
3. A list of your 20 chosen publications plus 4 copies of each divided into 4 separate packages that without further sorting can be sent directly to the referees. The applicant should be prepared to send copies of the remaining publications from their comprehensive list of publications with short notice if the Academic Appointments Board so desires.

4. Documentation of the applicant's supervision of postgraduate students should be provided by providing a list of the publications included in a thesis together with a copy of the Acknowledgements of the thesis concerned denoting supervision. The names of the examined PhD students should be given together with the date of successful examination. It should also be denoted clearly whether the applicant was registered as the main supervisor or as an assistant supervisor. The list of completed theses or theses in progress should be certified by the applicant's Head of Department or by the appropriate Faculty office. If for any reason there are cases of complicated supervisory situations or shared main supervisory roles, these should be described accurately and clearly in a separate document where the applicant describes his or her role in the supervision of a doctoral candidate (this document should be certified by the Head of Department).
5. A summary documenting all research funds obtained competitively during the last 5 years including clinical grants where the applicant is named on the grant application. The list should be in chronological order providing the following information: the year the grant was obtained, the amount of money granted per year, and who is the principal applicant of the grant.
6. A clear and concise scientific self-declaration where the applicant describes the scientific projects completed and the future plans for the coming years. It should be clearly stated which studies and scientific results the applicant wishes to be considered relevant to the appointment he or she has applied for.
7. A summary of teaching and educational qualifications see: www.med.lu.se/lfn Guidelines for employment as Professor/Senior Lecturer. The description should include the applicant's ability to initiate, develop and carry out new teaching and educational systems, and also his or her involvement in seminars and postgraduate courses. Please note: a clear and concise self-declaration of the applicant's vision for teaching and future ambitions for his or her development of teaching (maximum 2 pages) should be supplied.
8. A clear and concise summary of the applicant's administrative qualifications.
9. A summary of the applicant's third-stream activities describing interaction and communication with the wider community, for example see: Guidelines for Appointment as Professor: www.med.lu.se/lfn
10. Copies of documents containing the applicant's grades and qualifications together with any other relevant documentation requested.
